#### Monday 8th January - National Theatre Play

We will be showing *The Beaux Stratagem* from the National Theatre's vast back catalogue in the Club Rooms, using our new projector and screen. Susannah Fielding and Samuel Barnett lead the cast in George Farquhar's 1707 Restoration comedy classic.

The 'Beaux': Mr Aimwell and Mr Archer, two charming, dissolute young men who have blown their fortunes in giddy London. Shamed and debt-ridden, they flee to provincial Litchfield.

Their 'Stratagem': to marry for money. Lodged at the local inn, posing as master and servant, they encounter a teeming variety of human obstacles: a crooked landlord, a fearsome highwayman, a fervent French Count, a maid on the make, a drunken husband, a furious butler, a natural healer and a strange, turbulent priest.

But their greatest obstacle is love. When the Beaux meet their match in Dorinda and Mrs Sullen, they are most at risk, for in love they might be truly discovered.

Prompt start at 1930h, bring your own nachos! There is no charge for this event.

### Robin Hood for MayFest

Can you help with a RADS performance for MayFest? I'm planning a short panto-style version of a fifteenth century tale of Robin Hood - '*Robin & the Poor Knight*' it's one of the oldest of the tales, and nicely comedic. It's one I originally adapted as a two-hander, but it would work really well as a five-hander, with the parts allotted thus:

Robin Hood	male or female, any age
Poor Knight	male, older
Abbot	male, any age
Little John / Maid Marian	female, any age
Prior/Merry Man	male, any age

All parts may also be narrators at one point or another.

The piece would be around 20 minutes long, the style knockabout (imagine a troupe of fairly rough-and-ready wandering players), and ideally it would be off-book. However, the narration would be read from a book, which would be on stage and could also serve as a prompt.

All to happen on Monday 6th May, at Richmond Castle. Open air, with a wet weather alternative as required, a couple of performances during the day as part of a fairly packed programme!

Auditions to take place in late March, be ready for a couple of rehearsals a week through April...

This is a very special venue that not only makes a massive contribution to the region's heritage and tourism but punches well above its weight – in the heart of rural North Yorkshire – as a much-loved and well-respected performance venue.

"I am totally committed to building on the foundations that Clare Allen and previous managers have put in place to ensure that the Theatre goes from strength to strength for the benefit of the local community it serves and the much wider audiences who appreciate its unique historical significance – now and in the future."
