Four Awards for RADS at Sedgefield!

RADS had a very successful evening on Friday 15th September at the Sedgefield Drama festival with our two entries *The Form* and *Little Grimley presents Strictly Sex Factor (On Ice)*. Adjudicator Chris Baglin awarded Scott Fenney the **Best Actor** award for *The Form;* Rachel Hall was **Best Actress** for her very different roles in both plays (Chris didn't even realise it was the same actress until later!); Mike Walker was **Best Supporting Actor** for *Little Grimley* and we won the **Adjudicator's Award** for Coral Lincoln's daring roller-skating in *Little Grimley*.

Best Director - Tom Guest for Education, Education, Education, Education

Best Production - Education, Education, Education

Training Workshop for Mac computer and Qlab Software

Tony Wilcock, Technical Manager of the GTR has kindly agreed to run a training session on our new Mac computer of the QLab software which is also used by the theatre. QLab automates and controls lighting, audio and video cues which are programmed into the system according to the lighting design and audio and video files provided to it.

The workshop will be of particular interest to anyone with an interest in operating the sound and lighting system for us, and to prospective directors who would like to know what the system is capable of. This session is available only to a limited number of people (although further sessions can be arranged). If you would like to attend, please email Gregan asap - preference in the first instance will be given to those directing a play in the near future.
