Dan Westgarth (RADS member and manager of the Station Cinema) has kindly offered to host a RADS club night at the Station Cinema for a private screening of one of the much-praised National Theatre productions, Prima Facie starring Jodie Comer in a virtuoso performance.

The showing will be in Screen 3 at The Station Cinema. Screen 3 has a capacity of 28 - if more people want to attend then we will be moved to Screen 1 or 2.

This is an opportunity to see a performance that earned Jodie Comer three awards for Best Actor, including a Tony, for RADS members + your significant other free of charge. The screening will commence at 7.30 and runs, without interval, for two hours.

Prima Facie

Jodie Comer (Killing Eve) makes her 'masterful West End debut' (**** Guardian) in the UK premiere of Suzie Miller's award-winning play.

Tessa is a young, brilliant barrister. She has worked her way up from working class origins to be at the top of her game; defending; cross examining and winning. An unexpected event forces her to confront the lines where the patriarchal power of the law, burden of proof and morals diverae.

Prima Facie takes us to the heart of where emotion and experience collide with the rules of the game. Justin Martin directs this solo tour de force, captured live from the intimate Harold Pinter Theatre in London's West End.

Follow half-orphan Pip's extraordinary exploits with sisters Pippa and Poppy and best friend Harry Biscuit, as they attempt to escape the calculating clutches of the dastardly Mr Gently Benevolent, defeat the hideous Hardthrasher siblings, and deflect disaster at every turn! Will evil be vanquished by virtue? Can love triumph over hate?

Mark Evans' stage play is a hilarious, chaotic caper, featuring dastardly villains, preposterous names, pulsequickening romances, heart-rending death scenes, and definitely, probably, hopefully a happy ending.

Based on the award-winning BBC Radio 4 series, the play opened at The Watermill Theatre, Newbury, in 2022. It transferred to the Criterion Theatre in London's West End in 2023, where it featured a medley of many wellknown actors and comedians guesting as The Narrator. These included Tom Allen, Adjoa Andoh, Alexander Armstrong, Julian Clary, Jack Dee, Stephen Fry, Lee Mack, Stephen Mangan, Dermot O'Leary, Sue Perkins, Sally Philips and Nina Wadia.


