# Blue Stockings

The story of the first women to attend Girton College in Cambridge. Their trials and the opposition they faced from society which included other male students and lecturers leading ultimately to a violent protest. Read through: Monday 12th August 1930h. Auditions: Thursday 15th August 1930h. Rehearsals: from Thursday 22nd August and every Tuesday & Thursday thereafter. Sunday rehearsals will be held nearer the show week from 5pm till 7pm.

**CAST**: There are 24 characters but the play can be performed with 12 actors doubling up. I would prefer to have as many people involved as possible. The playing age of the 9 students should be <35.

### The Girls

Tess Moffat: Main protagonist. 1st year student at Girton. Passionate, scientific, longs for adventure. Will is in love with her but she loves Ralph. Hungry for knowledge. Celia Willbond: Diligent student, repeating her first year as was sent home with nervous exhaustion. Mindful of propriety/rules and reminds others. Special relationship with Tess.

**Carolyn Addison**: Rich bohemian. Has travelled the world. Wants to be a doctor. A rule breaker, encourages Tess's relationship with Ralph.

**Maeve Sullivan**: Quiet and intelligent. Lower social background. Sponsored by rich lady. Returns home because her mother has died and she has to look after her siblings.

#### The Bovs

**Ralph Mayhew**: Sympathetic to girls' cause. Romance with Tess but because of parental pressure marries someone else. Very upset about situation.

Will Bennet: Tess's childhood friend. As a result gets cold shoulder from other male students. Falls in love with Tess, promised her father he would protect her.

Lloyd: He is the most vocal opponent of the women and has strong held and arguably justifiable reasons although he feels threatened. Rich, competitive. Physically violent. Holmes: Privileged. Can't agree with women graduating but respects their courage and is ashamed of the violence. Edwards: Violinist, more sympathetic to girls. Bullied by other boys. He sings "The Last Rose of Summer".

### The Staff

**Elizabeth Welsh**: Mistress of Girton College, leads campaign for girls to graduate. Opposed to the way suffragettes behave but of firm disposition until the very end when she loses control and attacks the protesters. **Dr.Henry Maudsley**: Psychiatrist and lecturer. Firmly believes that men and women are biologically different and because of this women are adapted to fulfilling certain roles which do not include academia.

**Mr.Banks**: Science lecturer, supporter of the girls which puts him at odds with his colleagues, eventually leading to his dismissal.

**Miss Blake**: Moral science lecturer. Supporter of girls but in contrast to Ms.Welsh believes in the suffragette's campaign which causes confrontation.

**Prof.Collins/Anderson/Radleigh**: All sceptical of women's education to a varying degree.

The other smaller parts include **Minnie** (Girton's housemaid), **Miss Bott** (chaperone) and **Mr.Peck** (the gardener).
