Antigone - Readthrough, Auditions and Characters

Gregan will be hosting a readthrough of Antigone on the November clubnight, Monday 11th November 2024. The auditions will be the following night, Tuesday 12th at 1930h, with Thursday 14th reserved for follow-up auditions if required. Production dates are 20-22 March 2025.

Gregan has provided character guidelines as follows:

CHORUS [age / gender blind] narrator, story-teller, philosopher and the voice of Creon's conscience

CREON'S PAGE [10] [gender blind / small speaking role]

THE GENTLEMEN

CREON [mid 40s - mid 50s] King of Thebes, brother of Oedipus. Reluctant King in the aftermath of a civil war, but 'like a conscientious workman, he does his job' with no small degree of ruthlessness

HAEMON [early 20s] Creon's son; Antigone's fiancée. Being engaged to Antigone earns him the right to die sooner than he might otherwise have done'.

1st GUARD JONAS [39] Terrified at having to give the King bad news, boastful in front of his mates, derisively disbelieving that Antigone is who she says she is and totally out of his depth when guarding her in the condemned cell 2nd GUARD [30s+] [small speaking role]

3rd GUARD [30s+] [small speaking role]

THE LADIES

ANTIGONE [19] Youngest child of Oedipus. 'The tense, sallow, wilful, girl who will rise up alone against Creon, her uncle, the King'

ISMENE [21] Antigone's sister. 'The carefree and beautiful Ismene'

NURSE [50+] Long-serving servant who brought up Oedipus's 4 children - a mother hen

EURYDICE [mid 40s - mid 50s] Creon's wife [non-speaking role]
